

- WHAT: National Able Network, Inc., is a nonprofit agency working to serve families and communities by bringing together businesses and qualified job seekers of all ages, income and skill level.

Each client receives personalized career supports that integrate career coaching, specialized training, and direct connections to the job market. - Services to businesses including full assessment and analysis of current and future workforce needs, customized training options, and access to qualified job applicant pool
- Career transition and outplacement services
- Transitional and subsidized employment programs
- Sector-based training programs IT Career Lab and Retail Career Lab
